Accelerated Reader:

Many pupils in Primary 4, 5, 6 and 7 reached their target in AR last term receiving a token for a free hot chocolate in the Custom's House. There is only one week left before the end of this target period. There has been a big push within classes for all pupils to reach their target points, with a special reward given to the most successful class.

An end of Term 1 audit revealed that 83.4% of our children raised their reading age from September 2019. The figures show that some children increased their reading age by 1 month to as much as 2 years and 4 months which is incredible!

The statistics prove that the Accelerated Reading programme is a wonderful tool to help word recognition, word attack skills and their understanding of the written text. Well done to all our pupils and you as parents and guardians for encouraging our children to use the programme effectively with the positive outcomes being seen.

School Uniform: It is important that each child comes to school neat

and tidy. We are proud of our school uniform which reflects the individuality of our school and offers to

all children a common form of dress.

Full uniform includes school jumper, light blue polo

shirt and a navy skirt or navy trousers.

School uniform must be worn each day unless special

clothing is required e.g. for field trip.

School Visitors: We would ask all visitors to the school to make

appointments to see teachers either before the school day or after 3.10pm. Teachers are not permitted to leave their classes to speak to parents during the

school day.

Dinner:

The daily cost of school dinner is £2.60 per day (£13.00 per week). We would ask that money for the week be brought in on Mondays.

Free School Meals: Some children may be entitled to free meals. An application form may be obtained from the Education Authority Western Region, School Meals Department 1 Hospital Road, Omagh, Co Tyrone, BT79 OAW. Telephone (028 82 411411)

We are continuing to promote the Munch Box Challenge (a lunch Box initiative) during lunch time. We as a school are working together with the Health Promotion Department to promote healthy eating habits and improve oral health in children. Children taking lunch may bring one treat in their lunch box.

Party invitations: We ask that parents do not to send party invitations to school for circulation- this may cause distress to some children

Attendance:

The Department of Education is looking at attendance very closely at present. Good attendance is vital for every child. 'Every day matters.'

We get a monthly report of all children's attendance. If a child's attendance falls below 85% we are obliged to refer them to our Educational Welfare Officer.

If your child is absent please send a note or fill out the absence note in the homework diary. This is important as all absences must be coded on our system.

All children who walk to school or travel by car should use the small pedestrian gate. We ask that you do not use the main gate in the interest of the health and safety of all.

I ask that in the interest of pupil safety P.1 and 2 parents collecting children at 2.00pm also use only the pedestrian gate.

Only staff cars should enter the school car park.

Please do not park in the bus lay-by at the front of the school- this area is now clearly marked. Parking here presents a hazard for children boarding buses and prevents buses from pulling in.
